

Law School Clinic Public Directory Information Form

The Copyright Claims Board (CCB) is an alternative forum to federal court in which parties voluntarily seek resolution of copyright disputes where damages are \$30,000 or less. To facilitate this low-cost alternative to federal litigation, the CCB will maintain a directory of law school clinics that provide legal representation before the CCB on a *pro bono* basis. This directory will be available on the CCB website as a resource for CCB participants.

NOTE: A law school clinic does not need to be listed in the directory to participate in proceedings before the CCB (37 CFR § 234.2(a)).

Clinics wishing to be listed in the CCB clinic directory should provide all of the requested information below. The CCB requires this information because we would like to provide CCB participants with the information they need to make an informed decision regarding whether to seek law school clinic assistance. In addition, the clinic will have a duty to maintain the currency of information in the directory.

The law school clinic director must send the completed form to asktheboard@ccb.gov. Please type your answers directly into the form. Do not hand write your answers. Thank you.

The Clinical Law Program at the University of Maryland Carey School of Law is committed to providing legal services and counseling to under-respresented members of our community who could not otherwise afford an attorney. The Intellectual Property & Entrepreneurship Clinic ("IPEC") has largely fulfilled that mission to date through providing transactional services, including filing trademark and patent applications; assisting with copyright registrations; drafting intellectual property license and assignment agreements (including copyright assignments and licenses), nondisclosure agreements, and other contracts involving creation and ownership of IP rights; and providing counseling on creation of new business entities and, in some instances, assisting with the formation of a Maryland limited liability company or corporation. IPEC participates in the United States Patent and Trademark Office's Law School Clinic Certification Program for both patents and trademarks, and we have found this to be a tremendous experience for our students and a great service to our clients. However, students have had little opportunity to gain litigation experience, aside from participating in a few trademark opposition proceedings and an appeal before the USPTO's Trademark Trial and Appeal Board. We believe that by providing counseling and limited representation before the CCB, our students will greatly broaden their exposure to intellectual property law, and the clinic's clients will receive a valuable service that will assist them in building and defending their intellectual property portfolios.
